



## Rubric - 2024 Implementation Phase Application

### Prosperemos Juntos | Thriving Together

**Instructions:** This rubric will be used to assess each Implementation phase application. After careful consideration of the information provided by each coalition, the review team will discuss the criteria on the left side of the table, assigning a value of N/A, Initial, Developed, or Advanced and marking comments within that box to explain the selection. “N/A” means that the information was either not provided or that the coalition has not described or demonstrated consistent, effective effort to grow in that area during the past 9 months. “Initial” reflects a low level of attainment for that criteria: compared to peers, the coalition has not developed significantly. “Developed” and “Advanced” reflect higher levels of development relative to peers, with “Advanced” being reserved for coalitions who are exceeding expectations.

Coalitions will be assessed by the quality of their responses to application questions. The quantity of words - for example, maxing out the word count - will not, by itself, lead to a higher assessment. By early December 2024, all applicants will receive feedback about their application, regardless of acceptance into the Implementation phase.
